The 100 event was particularly well supported by Wrexham Reivers who provided the biggest Ch&NW informal group presence. 20% of riders were asked to assess a number of aspects of the event, such as route, refreshments, etc. on a basis of 5 for excellent, 4 for good, decreasing to 0 for poor. The overall average assessment was 4.9 and we were satisfied with that. The very decent weather probably created a feel good factor and contributed to this almost excellent rating.

There was a lot more competition for the Jim Skelding Trophy this year and it is encouraging that it was one by a junior rider (under 18) for the first time. Mike Cross in Presidential Chain, presented the trophy to the winner, Luke Johnson from Huntington, Chester aged 17 yrs and 12 days. Well done to Luke.
