HAWARDEN PARK REGULATIONS

1. Visitors are made to leave their dogs, animals, and the roads or paths, market street and further north on holidays except that sales from 2 pm until 6.30 pm during May, June, July & August 6.30 pm during March, April, September & October 4.30 pm during November, December, January & February

BUT PLEASE

Don't trespass from the main roads
 Don't leave gates unfastened or disturb the stock
 Don't interfere with shrubs, plants or flowers
 Don't be a "litter bug" but use baskets provided for rubbish
 Don't damage walls, doors, fences, or trees

2. The Old Castle has long been scheduled as an Ancient Monument, special rules are required for its care and preservation. Visitors admitted by Hawarden Lodge & Chapel's Gate from 2 pm on days (except Sundays & Thursdays) and during hours when Parks open. Admission is for each person for the benefit of the Greater Royal Infirmary.

3. Motors, Bikes and Dogs excluded. Expressions of large parties only admitted on special occasions from fact state office on previous applications. Sports, games & Parties are prohibited.

4. The Park is closed on Sundays. This notice is posted and printed in the park. Being printed from the Estate Office and printed in the address.
